## Aim

The primary aim of this programme is to develop leadership capacity across the Muslim communities in Europe. The type of leaders that will enable the Muslim community to develop strategies to contribute fully for the common good of both the Muslim and wider society. This course will also allow participants to realise their own leadership styles and to enhance and evolve their skills to ensure more productive and efficient working methods.

## Philosophy

The educational principles underpinning the programme use adult learning models and require participants to fully and actively engage in the process of learning. The programme will enable participants to explore assumptions, beliefs and attitudes about themselves, the organisations in which they work, the environments in which they operate and the wider society – in order to enable them to ‘do differently’ where necessary and possible in their everyday lives.

## Learning Outcomes

The key learning outcomes sought are as follows:

- ◆ To develop and enhance your core leadership capacity.
- ◆ To provide an environment for you to explore your assumptions, ideas and deepen your values and ethical framework.
- ◆ To develop leadership skills to enable Muslims to participate in wider society.
- ◆ To deepen your self-awareness, self development, reflective practice and emotional intelligence.
- ◆ To develop your understanding of the diversity and dynamics of the British Muslim community.



## Programme Content

- ◆ To develop a community vision and the role of the self in the realisation of that vision
- ◆ To enhance leadership capacity and capability
- ◆ To provide opportunities to explore assumptions and ideas
- ◆ To help enhance values and ethical framework
- ◆ To enhance self awareness, personal development and emotional intelligence
- ◆ To nurture the ability to understand other people, their environment and work effectively in challenging situations
- ◆ To develop reflective skills
- ◆ To Provide access to the necessary support systems in the realisation of the vision.

Participants will be selected by the following criteria:

- ◆ Track record of participating & serving within the Muslim community
- ◆ Age 23 – 50 years with a minimum of 2 years of work experience
- ◆ Can give commitment of time and energy to benefit from the programme
- ◆ Has creative ideas and wants to shape and influence the future
- ◆ Wishes to learn from experience, group work, as well as formal teaching situations

**Cost** The cost of the CoEJ leadership development program is £540. Those participants who are able to afford the full cost are encouraged to pay as much of the costs as they can. For those participants that require assistance, CoEJ is offering a subsidy (through donors) of £295 per person leaving a **fee of only £245** for participants to pay.
